In Memorium

Dave Riggs passed away on April 26, 2012.

He served LGMS in numerous ways and was special friend to many of us.

We send our love and condolences to Lois and the rest of his family.

Dave Riggs (President LGMS 2003-2004)

Dave Riggs was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1939. He attended Lutheran parochial schools there until he and his family (4 bothers and 3 sisters) moved out to Parshallville. Dave attended school in and graduated from the 21 Building in Old Hartland (later to become the first shop of the LGMS) in 1963. He promptly joined the Army and had a really good time of it for four peaceful years in America. After the Army he got married and took his young family to Carlton, Michigan, where he worked for 30 years at Detroit Diesel. Dave and Lois then bought Dave's mother's house in Parshallville where they continue to live to this day.

Dave's bother Bill was president of the LGMS in 1987 and Dave became active in the LGMS in about 1997. Dave promptly assumed almost every position on the Board before taking over the presidency in 2003. One of Dave's greatest accomplishments came in 2005 when he and Steve Assamacher secured the Metal Working Shop at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center at 9525 M-59 for our society. He was instrumental in our transfer from the rather antiquated facility in old Hartland to the fine, modern, gem, mineral and lapidary workshop we now enjoy.

After his presidency, Dave continued to be a one-man cheer-leader for our society. Dave taught many children's lapidary classes, both for the 4-H kids and Boy and Girl Scout troops from the Hartland area. Dave also gave many talks to senior groups and to all those who expressed an interest in rocks, gems and minerals.

Every year when we held our Annual Gem and Mineral show, Dave would always place his mineral collections in the display case in the entrance of the Cromain Library thereby giving us a lot of advertisement for our show. Dave has always been there for us until just recently when he has had to curtail his activities due to debilitating health conditions.
