MY WEEKEND IN CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA

My main purpose in going to Cedar Rapids was to attend the Midwest Federation of Mineralogical and Geological Societies (MWF) Annual Convention. This is the one we are holding in conjunction with our show in September of 2020, with lodging, meals and meetings being held at Waldenwoods Resort. Our setup will be similar to Cedar Rapids, as the convention was at the Ramada Plaza while the Cedar Valley Rocks and Minerals Society's (CVRMS) 55th Annual Rock, Gem and Mineral Show was held at Hawkeye Downs, about a mile south of the hotel.

In addition to the MWF holding its annual meeting, the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies (**AFMS**) also held its National Show and Convention. The AFMS part of the rock show consisted mainly of judging competitive displays and having an information table. I attended the delegates' meetings on Friday and got a much better understanding of their purpose, and how the MWF fits in with the other five regions: California, Eastern, Northwest, Rocky Mountain, and South Central.

There is an AFMS Scholarship Foundation, and it awards \$48,000 total in Scholarship Grants each year to 12 graduate or masters-level students, studying in a related field. Candidates are nominated by the Clubs in the Regions, and two scholarships per region are granted. To date, they have awarded over \$2 million in donations.

A totally separate group, American Lands Access Association (**ALAA**), presented its case for keeping Federal Lands open to Recreational Rockhounding. They would like clubs to complete a summary sheet after each field trip that would allow them to collect data that will strengthen the arguments, such as quantifiable use and economic impact. ALAA promises that all information will be kept confidential, and only used in the aggregate, or if needed to defend a club in a dispute.

The CVRMS Rock Show was awesome! There were 23 vendors, and it had about 5000 visitors over two days. The venue, Hawkeye Downs, was about twice as big as ours. It had three stations breaking geodes and an incredible sluicing operation. My favorite tee shirt: STOP – I Saw A Rock!
