- 1. Call to Order 11:27 am
 - a. In Attendance: a total of 11 Members including board members
- 2. Reviewed club goals and board member responsibilities
- 3. Reviewed club purchase guidelines as follows:
 - a. Maintenance of machines, emergency repairs, hospital bills, first aid and emergency supplies needed, may be purchased and will be reimbursed, with a receipt, for up to \$100; see Treasurer. Supplies greater than \$100 will have to be submitted and approved by the board.
 - b. All other non-emergency shop supplies need to be submitted to the President for review. For those supplies costing \$100 or less approval by the President is needed in order to proceed. All purchases over \$100 will need final approval by the LGMS Board of Directors.
- 4. AFMS (American Federation of Mineralogical Societies) has honored George & Anna Pernicano with its Scholarship Foundation Award. In George and Anna's honor, two post-graduate students of U of M Earth Sciences School will be chosen and awarded a one-time scholarship of \$4,000 each.

This foundation began distributing Scholarships in 1964 To promote popular interest and education in the various Earth Sciences, and in particular the subjects of Geology, Mineralogy, Paleontology, Lapidary and other related subjects, and coordinating the work and efforts of all persons and groups interested therein; to encourage such means to strive toward greater international good will and fellowship.

5. 2020 Rockhound Dream Show has been cancelled

a. The Board unanimously agreed to cancel the show due to health, safety, timing and liability concerns. We reviewed several issues, Below are the main ones as follows:

- i. **Health and Safety**: For the health & safety of the club members and the attendees, we are being cautious to ensure ALL remain healthy by canceling the show.
- ii **Timing**: Mid August is the time we <u>POSSIBLY</u> may be able to get back into the shop if the government ban is lifted and our school location is open. If this does come true, this timing would only allow less than 30 days, which is an insufficient amount of time to properly prepare for our Show.
- Iii **Liability**: What is the liability on the club and the school if someone comes down with COVID-19?
- 6. Face Masks are being made and sold by the Club! The masks will have pictures of rocks on them and will be made by club members. We are asking for VOLUNTEERS to sew masks. Please contact Cinda for details.
- 7. Once we Return to the shop, members will be required to wear masks indoors for the safety of ALL and will be available for purchase at the club.
