Data, images, and information on the Sternberg Museum of Natural History collections is now available online as a result of a four-year project at Fort Hays State University. The museum, famed for its extensive fossil collection, is in Hays, Kansas. The information can be accessed at Sternberg.fhsu.edu. Click on "Research and Collections" and choose "Paleontology" from the drop-down menu. Scroll down and click on the left-hand blue "Paleontology Collections" button. It was reported that more than 23,000 specimens are covered.
