Membership Dues Increase Information

This past Thursday afternoon a silversmith was inquiring about our upcoming vote on increasing the dues. She was asking very good questions, which any interested member might have. I thought it would be a good idea to summarize information for the Board to use in any upcoming meetings, or possibly use portions in the newsletter for August.

The 1st really good questions were... Don't we have \$35,000 in our savings account? Why would we need to increase the dues? Why would a tiny, almost non-profit, club need that much money?

Here are some of my answers: We have \$25K in our savings account and \$10K in something we call a Building Fund. The Building Fund is not set aside to buy/rent a new building. It is more like a renovation fund. We know the school would like us to make some electrical upgrades which could be quite costly. We may also need to replace the counter under the polishers at the 600, 1200, and 3000 grit. Floor tiles may become an issue in the near future. It is my belief that the way we were able to build part of our nest egg was by putting on larger, and more profitable shows from 2016 to 2019, due in good part to sales from the Silent Auction and Club Tables. We have not spent a lot of money on new equipment after the shows.

Here is what I think every member should know: The Dues Committee was targeting to increase Dues and/or Daily Fees in order to maintain our current savings AND create an additional \$4000 per year. The breakdown was as follows.. \$2,400 additional money for rent, to cover the \$200 per month increase. \$900 additional cost to hold our show in the gym. \$700 more for the increase in the cost of supplies such as blades, sanding belts, diamond belts, expandable drums, belts, and so forth.

If we find a new place to hold a Large Rockhound's Dream Show indoors, we will need to get a permit to hold it. There could be a large fee involved with that. The reason we do not obtain a permit now is because the school has told the Township that we are holding the event in the same building as our workshop, and we do not have large numbers of people attending.

The average number of members in a year from 2015 to 2019 was 250. So if each member paid \$15 more, that would generate \$3,750. We currently have 120 members and we are slowly beginning to accept new ones. It could take a couple of years to get back to that number. So we will be eating into that savings anyway.

The estimated pre-Covid number of people in the shop per week averaged over the year was chosen to be 50 per week over 40 weeks. The building is closed 3 weeks of the year. It would be lower in the summer and winter months and higher in the spring and fall. The club pays a couple of thousand dollars every December to the MWF for insurance.

Bill Magee has spent time calculating the increase in our maintenance cost from 2015 to 2021. Diamond wheels cost \$35 more. Diamond 10" blades cost \$10 more, and need to be replaced every other month. Oil costs \$100 more per drum. And there are many more items.

As for changing the date the Dues need to be paid: That will require a change to the By-laws. It will also require a discussion by the board to decide that if the date is moved to Sept. 30th, whether there will be a 25% refund, or credit given when renewing dues. (I think there should be.) Cari had the idea to get the membership increase passed first. Then work on changing the date late, such as early 2022.

When we have the General Membership vote we need to allow for 3 options.

- 1) \$60 annual membership fee and \$2 daily fee or;
- 2) \$65 annual membership fee and \$1 daily fee or;
- 3) No increase

It is our job to explain why number 3 would be a really bad option.

This vote was intended to take place on March 17, 2020. Our checking account is down about \$3000 from that time frame. Fortunately through the rent reductions, and marvelous efforts of members volunteering for our 2 outdoor rock shows, and 100 people paying for new memberships even when we couldn't be open regularly, we have been able to sustain ourselves. We have been able to postpone the rent increase by one year already. Hopefully we will be able to go back to our full operating hours in September, but then we will be paying the full amount for rent.
