- **1- Call to Order** 6:10 pm; Motion to approve minutes by Cinda Dawson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bryant Hiiter. With unanimous vote to approve minutes as is.
- **2- Roll Call:** a total of 16 Members including 2 board members (Cari Jacob, Cinda Dawson).
- **3- Guest Secretary needed:** Marianna Ziegler-Hickey offered to write and Cari Jacob typed.

## 4- President's Report (Cari Jacob)-

- **B.** August/September meeting dates changed due to availability at park and meeting before fall show.
- C. Dues Committee: Meeting for the Dues Committee was held. Three dues proposals were posted in the August newsletter and will be presented to the members for a vote in September general meeting.
- **D. Fall Covid protocols** We will align with the school policy in September when they notify us at start of school. Updates will be posted as we are notified.

# 5. Vice President's Report (Cinda Dawson)-

- A. Update on MMS recent picnic invitation at Waterford Oaks Park, 24+ MMS members and 4 LGMS members joined in.
- **B. Membership Update:** Family of 3 just joined; Cinda will be asking people who have inquired about joining the club, to make appointments and work with a club member as a sponsor.

# 6. Treasurer's Report (from Linda Sheedy text):

**A.** Club funds are down approx. \$1800. \$1700 of that was a silver purchase and we will over time get that back.

# 7. Chairperson's Report/ Shop Chair (Cinda spoke for Bill Magee who is on the mend):

- A. Gayland Allen and Paul Runge helped clean out the big saw recently and Cinda noticed maybe the blade needed to be replaced? Possible fixes were discussed and also the cost to replace would be about \$180.
- **B.** Jim Hansen asked if we could look into replacing the old band saw with a new Taurus ring saw. About \$300 after discount. Since not enough voting board members were present, this was tabled for a future discussion.
- **C.** An old piece of shag carpet was requested by Cari Jacob to replace the oily one in the big saw room. Several members offered to replace.
- D. A demo machine was donated to our club by Kingsley North: three 8" wheels for shaping and three 8" wheels for polishing. Jim Hansen offered to help determine the location in the shop for the new station. It has its own pump and tubing, just needs a water source and waste water place. Ed Oller delivered the machine to the school and Gayland Allen & Phil Virta helped move it into the shop.

#### 8. Old Business:

**A. Fall show** will be held Saturday, 9/18/21 from 9-5 at the Waterford Christ Lutheran Church. Ann Marie placed \$25 deposit and the rest (\$75) will be remitted soon. Discussion was held regarding the vendor fees which were previously \$50 for nonmembers and \$25 for members. Earlier a member had suggested that we raise the fees slightly. Mark Ridenour made a motion to raise both fees by \$10 (\$60 non member & \$35 member) Lori Keefer 2<sup>nd</sup> motion. 4 voted YES and 11 voted NO.
