Call to Order – 6:03 pm

1. **Roll Call:** a total of 10 Members including board members. Ed motioned to approve the minutes with no changes and Jane seconded. Motion passed.

2. President & VP Report:

A. LGMS Covid Procedure – Winter

2021-2022: For our safety and health risk reduction in the workshop, we've developed this winter protocol based on recent exposure by a symptom free member (Friday, 11/12/2021). This new protocol is within the school and state guidelines. If Covid exposure is reported at the shop (a positive Covid test result), all members present will quarantine from the shop for 10 days, or have a negative Covid test result 5 days (or more) after exposure. A board member will notify the members present on the day of exposure by phone call, text, or email as soon as we are informed. The Covid positive member may return to the shop after 10 symptom free days (meaning NO coughing, fever, sneezing and other flu-like symptoms). Masks are required for unvaccinated members. Masks are strongly encouraged for all vaccinated members, but still optional at this time.
