### LGMS Board Meeting January 25, 2022, 1:00 pm

Call to Order – 1:02 pm

 Roll Call: a total of 7 Members including 6 board members. Cinda motioned to approve the minutes with no changes and Bill 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passed.

### 2. President & VP Report

- A. Update on donations for Zach: Cari just dropped off another \$75 to Zach's Mom.
- B. Update on Bob's Donations: there is an envelope at the shop to add additional dollars. Sharon is upholding Bob's wishes not to have a funeral.

Robert Krautheim 6/13/46 – 1/1/22 R.I.P.

"Big Bob" and Sharon Krautheim joined LGMS in 2005. They were introduced in this article from the November 2005 edition of *The Living Stones* newsletter:

We would like to welcome Robert Krautheim, who, having recently retired from Ford Motor, has agreed to make jewelry with all interested persons. He studied under Joe Stine and Derlick, New Mexico artists and teachers. He studied design from Ms. Phillups at Robertson High School in Las Vegas, New Mexico. He went on to study lost wax casting under professor Lipki at New Mexico Highlands University. He has been trained in traditional Native American styles of the Southwest, including freeform, metal clays, as well as the lost wax casting method. His wife, Sharon, was an Earth Science Minor at New Mexico Highlands University. She encouraged him to do his own stone cabs. The bulk of his work has been "singles"; each small part soldered on and designed with one person in mind. He does most work in silver, turquoise and coral in the Southwest styles, including a squash blossom necklace with each silver bead hand made. Zuni inlay is the most requested. A thunderbird man's watchband is his most impressive work.

During the past years, Big Bob has contributed to LGMS immeasureably. Cari and Cinda have tried to express his significance:

Cinda said: Big Bob has been a wonderful teacher, silversmithing guru, and friend for over a decade at LGMS. We are all saddened by his passing. His contributions over the years have helped our club become what it is today. Dozens of metalsmiths, and scores more lapidary artists, have learned great skills from his wise tutelage. All thanks to the many hours, and tools he provided week, after week.

Cari said: May he rest in peace with us remembering his beautiful smile, generous heart, incredible talent and time spent instructing all our members. His upbeat and warm personality is instilled in our hearts forever.
