when board meetings are held in the shop.)


The Historian's History.....Chuck Amberger

Born April ninth 1935... the fourth child of an immigrant family of six... fleeing Hitler's Germany. Raised on a farm in Farmington Mi. where I attended a one-room schoolhouse that taught K through 6. The school always had an attendance of less than 30 children. For a while I was the smartest kid in the fourth grade...I was the only kid in the fourth grade.

We moved to Detroit in 1948 where I attended Catholic schools and I graduated from St.Mary of Redford in 1953. I joined the U.S. Navy in 1954 to 1958 and then attended the University of Detroit for three years. I joined the Ford Motor Company Scientific Lab in Dearborn Michigan in 1961 as a Technician and earned an Associate Degree in Metalurgy in 1974. I moved to the Ford Motor company Glass Division Laboratory as an Engineer in 1985 and retired in 1991.

I joined the Livingston Gem and Mineral Society in 1992 when Johnny Johnson was president. I became Vice President in 1994 under Ken Bendik who moved up north in 1995. I finished out his term and served as President for the next two years as well. In 2006 I took the presidency again for two years because no one else would take the job... that's the way it was in those days and I certainly didn't want the club to fold. No President wants to see the club collapse on his or her watch which is why this club is going to be around for a long, long time. Members of this society should know that this club could never have started without the kindness and generosity of people like Max Schultz who donated all the original rocks, minerals and lapidary equipment from his rock shop in Cohochta. Michigan. It was Clarence and Hazel Morgan and Bill Horton who brought all the lapidary equipment back to the school in old Hartland.

I joined this society back in the time when the founding fathers and mothers were still active members of this club. I had the honor of working close with Johnny Johnson, Nelson and Marian Short and Bill Horton. Nelson Short was a fine silversmith and Marian gave me most of Nelson's silver equipment when he died. I was lucky enough to learn silversmithing from Bob Krautheim... probably the most talented and creative artisan who ever graced our doorstep. I also had the honor of holding every position and office that this society offers except for editor...but, fortunately, someone else is handling that job!
