February Board Meeting Minutes

Date: 02/19/25, at 6 pm; location: Red Olive. Meeting called to order at 6:04 pm. Roll Call: 8 Members were present: Terri Ridenour, AnnMarie McFadden, Joe Musulf, Bryant Hiiter, Linda Sheedy, Max Runnels, Cinda Wilson, Cari Jacob. Approve Agenda: Cinda Wilson made a motion to approve the February 19th agenda, 2nd by Cari

Jacob. All in favor, motion passed. Approve January Minutes: Joe Musolf made a motion to approve the January 21st minutes, 2nd by Linda Sheedy. All in favor, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report - Linda Sheedy

• We are currently in good standing.

• Most of our income in January was from new members' dues or renewals.

• About 1/2 of the 300 members have renewed their dues as of the meeting date.

President's Report - Terri Ridenour

• We want to have a continuous cleaning process and not leave junk on the tables.

• We need to clean and better organize the rooms between the Big Saw and the Library.

• Pop isn't being rotated and some has expired.

• The back corner of the kitchen is full of clutter

and we need more room for faceting equipment.There was a mouse in the shop so we should put

Old bettles of salad dressing need to be thrown

• Old bottles of salad dressing need to be thrown away.

• We should downsize the amount of items in the kitchen cupboards, and we can ask Sue W if she would like to help because she did a great job cleaning before the show.

• The Midwest Federation meeting will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska on April 4th-5th.

O It is the president's discretion who is picked to attend as a delegate from LGMS.

• Being a delegate should be considered a reward for doing a good job.

• The delegate should give a presentation or report on news from the meeting.

O It is a 12 hour drive. The board will consider giving gas money and some money for meals.

Vice President's Report - Joe Musolf

• The Middle Trim Saw blade bent after one week and then again after 3 weeks.

• We want to limit people's use of cutting buckets of field stones.

• Joe has been training people to clean the oil in the trims saws, so oil has been better.

• Perhaps we can reduce noise in the shop by putting the 10" auto feed saw in with the Big Saw, and move the other 10" saws into the adjacent room.

• We can add the 14" saw with a heavy duty blade and use that one for field stone.

• Ann Marie suggested eliminating the 8" oil saw and obtaining another 6" water saw.

• The only limitation on cutting shells is not to cut large ones. People should wear a mask and use plenty of water for small ones. This should be added to the New Member Training Procedure.

• We should start certifying people to use the Big Saw, and only allow people on a published list to use it.

• We spent \$530 on saw blades in 2024.

Old Business

• Cari made 30 membership packages.

• She gets deals for making 500 to 1000 copies.

• The locker sheet is color coded, and she will see who has not paid for 2025.

• What do we do if a member does not renew and they have lost their drawer key?

• Settlers Park still needs to be reserved for summer meetings. Cari will follow up.

New Business: Field Trip

• Nancy Bartel is planning a field trip to the Upper Penninsula.

• At the March General Meeting, Nancy would like to give a presentation on 3 different blacklights. Members will want the best and brightest kind for the field trip.

• Nancy also had a good idea for modifying a golf bag to haul rocks.

May Pop-up Show:

• There was an informal agreement to move the Spring show to May 31st.

• The show should end at 4 pm instead of 5 pm.

• The show time (with set-up and tear-down) will be 7am to 6pm.

- Put Terri's contact information on the flyer.
- Still \$50 for dealers and \$25 for members.
- Encourage members to share booths.
- There are usually 15 spots available.
- We cannot spread onto the grass.

• We do not usually invite big dealers because there is not much profit.

• We usually invite the Waterford club members to sell.

• Inviting the Flint Club will be dependent on how many spaces are left.

• No booths down the middle of the parking lot because then people cannot drive in their cars to load up after the show.

• We need to update the dealer and member forms for the spring show.

Chuck Bruce's Class:

• We are very fortunate to have Chuck Bruce agree to teach a jewelry inlay class in May, and a lapidary knife class in the future.

• He sells at the Ann Arbor art fair, and teaches at William Holland.

• The class cost is pricey but in line with other instructors.

• The minimum number of students is 8? And there is a waiting list.

• The cost is \$350 to Chuck, plus \$50 which goes to LGMS for material and acetylene use.

• The shop will be shut down for the class on May 29th and 30th, a Thursday and Friday.

LGMS will notify members about the shutdown thru signs in the shop, May newsletter, and email.
We may have to disturb Chuck's class to get flags for the Spring Pop-up Show.

• Cinda Wilson made a motion to approve Chuck Bruce's class on May 29th and 30th as proposed by Lori Hart's email description. 2nd by AnnMarie McFadden. All in favor, and motion passed.

4-H Classes in April:

• We will teach 10 kids for the first 4 Mondays in April.

• There will be 2 groups and the classes run from 6-8 pm.

• Many of the kids want to do silversmithing as they've done lapidary for many years.

• We need to think of projects that take 4 hours.

New Show Chair Needed:

- We need to advertise the opening on Facebook and in the newsletter.
- We need new postcards and flyers printed to post at spring shows people attend. Cari will have them made.
- Ed can still recruit vendors and bring postcards to shows.
- Cari can teach Terri most of the show- running details.
